Skiptothe goodpart named Horse of the Year

Skiptothe goodpart, a hard-hitting track record-setter who won or placed in more than half of his starts in 2006, was named South Carolina-bred Horse of the Year.

The son of Skip Away, bred by Camden Stud and Skip Away LLC, campaigns for Four-Board Stable, a partnership headed by bloodstock agent Jim Cullen, who bought him for \$27,000 at the 2003 Fasig-Tipton Texas 2-year-olds in training sale.

In 21 career starts, Skiptothe goodpart has earned \$51,517. His 2006 campaign consisted of nine starts, four wins and a third, for earnings of \$29,350. Each of his victories came in starter allowance company, and included back-to-back wins at Turfway Park and Keeneland in September and October.

South Carolina's other stars included the talented filly **Icy One O Four**, who won or placed in three of her four starts at 2 last season, including a third in the Donna Freyer Stakes at Philadelphia Park. Icy One O Four, who broke her maiden at Laurel in November, campaigns for her breeder, longtime South Carolina horseman Othniel H. Wienges, who also stands her sire, Valiant

Lark (by Buffalo Lark), at his farm in St. Matthews.

Wienges was honored as South Carolina's breeder of the year for 2006. He was represent-

ed by two state-bred champions, with the other being **Francie's Smile**, champion 3-year-old filly.

Francie's Smile is a daughter of Kokand, who has built a

strong record throughout the Mid-Atlantic region and is the sire of additional two 2006 South Carolina-bred champions, the brothers **Vine Street School** (3-
